We are happy to announce our first Burren Workshop in association with the Burren Beo Trust. The Burren is Ireland's most enigmatic landscape: A limestone karst area of outstanding beauty, which hosts a unique flora that includes species from the Mediterranean and the Arctic.

We will visit the Burren in its most enchanting season: Autumn. It's a season of light and colour. While the last wildflowers stand their ground, the green of summer is being replaced by warm brown tones and the fruits of the Burren add splashes of red and blue to the landscape.

Our base will be the Burren Beo Café in Kinvara, a small village on the Northern border of the Burren. The workshop will start Friday evening with drink and talk. Not too much of the first one though. We will have an early morning ahead of us.

On Saturday we will start before sunrise, which is around 7am in September, and work until sunset around 7.30pm. Mornings and evenings will keep us busy with landscape photography on different locations. During the day we will tackle macro themes that will range from the abundant berries to the more elusive wildflowers of autumn. Please note that berries can only be eaten after they have been photographed!

In-between we will find some time to chat about technique and theory of photography and for reviewing your images. The day could look a bit like this:

- 7.00am - 9.00am: Landscape Photography on location
- 9.00am - 10.30am: Breakfast at your B&B
- 10.30am - 1.30pm: Theory, image review & lunch
- 1.30pm - 4.00pm: Macro / Close Up Photography on location
- 4.00pm - 5.00 pm: Tea Break
- 5.00pm - Darkness: Landscape Photography on location

The price for the weekend is € 320.00/person and includes tuition, lunch, tea and membership in the Burren Beo Trust. Places are limited to only 8 to ensure everybody will get attention and to create a relaxed atmosphere.

The schedule can be changed anytime. Unfortunately we are still in Ireland which means unpredictable weather. But if it should bucket down we will still find something to do.
